



World Agility Open (WAO) Team Finland Selection

Finnish Team Tryout February 2nd, 2020, Vantaa

The WAO team Finland will be consisted by the **combined results of three runs**: agility, snooker and jumping. All the runs are unofficial. Judges Ritva Herrala (FIN) and Jason Bartram (UK)

Running order for the runs of the tryout day is:
Agility, Snooker and Jumping

The final run of the day will be chosen maximum of 30 dogs in each jump height division.

Tryout will be competed in **four jump height divisions**, same as in WAO:

- **300**
 - dog height at withers 320mm & under
 - jump height 300 mm

- **400**
 - dog height at withers 410mm & under
 - jump height 400 mm
- **500**
 - dog height at withers 500mm & under
 - jump height 500 mm
- **600**
 - dog height at withers over 500mm
 - jump height 600 mm

Dogs will be measured for the tryout jump height divisions by FCI tuomari Jessi Landen and UK judge Jason Bartram if needed at the tryout.

Winner in each run will get 50 points, the total sum of the points in all three runs will be the result of the dog. If points are even with two or more dogs, they will do a re-run on the last competition format of the day, depending on the schedule as long as they will have placements defined.

Placement/points/height division (agility/jumping/snooker):

1. 50p
2. 40p
3. 35p
4. 20p
5. 15p
6. 10p
7. 8p
8. 6p
9. 4p
10. 2p

Final team according to placements and total points/height division:

- 1st will get spot in all three classes
- 2nd will get spot in all three classes
- 3rd will get spot in all three classes
- 4th will get a spot as a reserve (shall travel to venue if wants)

Dogs with placings 5th to 10th will be registered as team's reserve dogs and they will travel to competition if they want.

The handler and the dog must take part in all classes. If not, the handler and the dog will lose their spot and it will be forwarded to next team in results.

Selection of the Junior Team Member

Each country is entitled for one junior representative per height category. Juniors will compete on same courses with others in WAO. The junior team will get a place in all classes in WAO. In the tryout competition juniors will compete in the same courses with adults. The results will be separated for the juniors apart from the normal tryout results into a separate result sheet and the points are given by the placements in junior category. The winner of each run will earn 50 points. The final results will be the total points from all three runs. If the points are even the teams will rerun the last course and the rerun order will finalise the ranking.

Placement/Points (agility/jumping/snooker):

1st	50p
2nd	40p
3rd	35p
4th	20p
5th	15p
6th	10p
7th	8p
8th	6p
9th	4p
10th	2p

Final team according to placements and total points/height division:

- 1st will get spot in all three classes
- 2nd will get a spot as a reserve (shall travel to venue if wants)

Dogs with placings 3rd to 4th will be registered as team's reserve dogs and they will travel to competition if they want.

The handler and the dog must take part in all classes. If not, the handler and the dog will lose their spot and it will be forwarded to next team in results.

ABOUT WAO

Classes and Events

Competitors will vie for four World Championship titles at the WAO, three individual and one team.

INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION

Pentathlon Championship

The Pentathlon consists of 2 rounds of Agility, 2 rounds of Jumping, and 1 round Speedstakes. The combined results from the 5 classes determine the Individual ***Pentathlon World Champion***. One world champion will be declared in each jump height.

Scoring is cumulative; faults are added to time, and the lowest score wins in all aspects of the Pentathlon. **Each country can enter 3 dogs per jump height.**

Biathlon Championship

The Biathlon consists of 1 round of Agility followed by 1 round of Jumping. The combined results of the two classes determine the ***Biathlon World Champion***. One world champion will be declared in each jump height.

Scoring is cumulative; least faults wins with time as tie breaker only, in all aspects of the Biathlon. **Each country can enter 3 dogs per jump height.**

Games Championship

The Games Championships consists of 1 round of Snooker followed by 1 round of Gamblers. The combined results of the two classes determine the ***Games World Champion***. One world champion will be declared in each jump height.

Scoring is cumulative; highest number of points wins with time as tie breaker only, in all aspects of the Games Championship. **Each country can enter 3 dogs per jump height.**

NATIONAL TEAM COMPETITION

The Team competition consists of 2 rounds of Agility, 2 rounds of Jumping, and 1 round Speedstakes. The combined results from the 5 classes determine the ***Team World Champion***.

Each country will be eligible to enter 1 team. Each team will be comprised of 4 dogs, 1 dog from each jump height. Only 3 dogs per team will run in the 2 Agility rounds and the 2 Jumping rounds. No height can sit out twice; for example, a country's team entry might look like this:

- Class 1: 300, 400, 500
- Class 2: 300, 500, 600
- Class 3: 300, 400, 600
- Class 4: 400, 500, 600

Scoring is cumulative; faults are added to time, and the lowest score wins in all aspects of the Pentathlon.

OVERVIEW OF CLASSES

Agility

The object of this class is to negotiate a full course of agility equipment. There are a minimum of 19 obstacles and a maximum of 20.

Jumping

The object of this class is to negotiate a course without contact equipment. There are a minimum of 19 obstacles and a maximum of 20.

Speedstakes

The object of this class is to negotiate a Jumping course that also includes an A-frame. There are a minimum of 19 obstacles and a maximum of 20.

Team Relay

The object of this class is for 4 dogs and 4 handlers to work together to perform a relay course as a team. There is 1 dog from each jump height on a team. The 300 and 400 dogs will run at 300mm (11.81in), and the 500 and 600 dogs will run at 500mm (21.65in). Each dog on the team will perform a minimum of 15 obstacles and a maximum of 20 obstacles.

Gamblers

The goal of Gamblers is to accumulate as many points as possible within the time allotted by the judge, and then to make a strategic decision to perform one of the two short "gamble" sequences within a specified time period to earn bonus points.

Snooker

The object of the game is to earn as many points as possible within the course time set by the judge. Scoring is similar to the billiards game of Snooker; however, the judge may place the obstacles in the ring in any position.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The WAO Team Finland 2020 will be chosen in tryout in Vantaa at February 2nd 2020. The tryout is the only way to get into the team Finland. The tryout will be done only by the points of placements in three different runs on the tryout day.

The tryout registration will be done via a link that is delivered later.

Tryout fee is 45 euros/dog/tryout day

Team Training days

The team training will be held once. Participating is voluntary but the costs will be divided evenly to the entire team regardless one is taking part or not. The training is only meant for dogs chosen for the team.

Travelling organizing & costs

The competition travel is done at one's own cost but the team management will help organizing travelling if needed and is helping at the competition place.

The chosen Finnish team may have some fundraising and/or do sponsoring deals by mutual decision. The team management's travelling costs will be paid by the team.
